Get more mileage out of your Stampin' Write markers with this easy coloring technique!



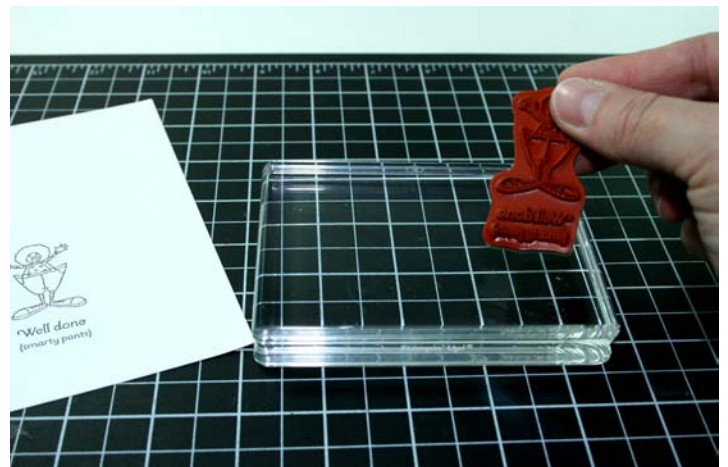
Supplies:

- Basic Black Ink
- US White cardstock
- Stampin' Write Markers
- Blender Pen
- Acrylic Block



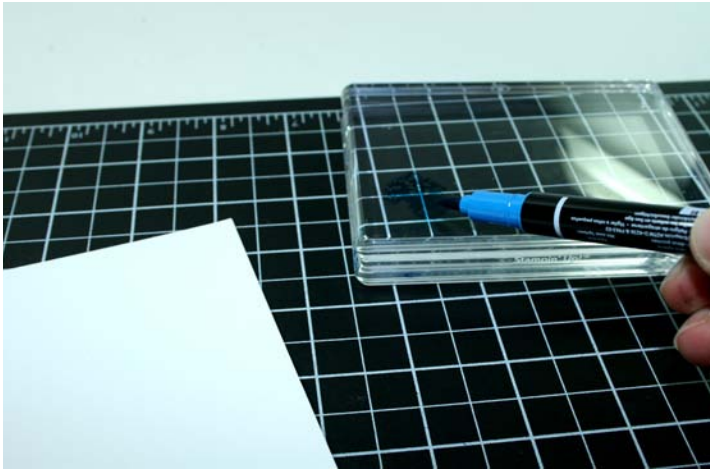
Step One:

Stamp image on US White cardstock with Basic Black ink.



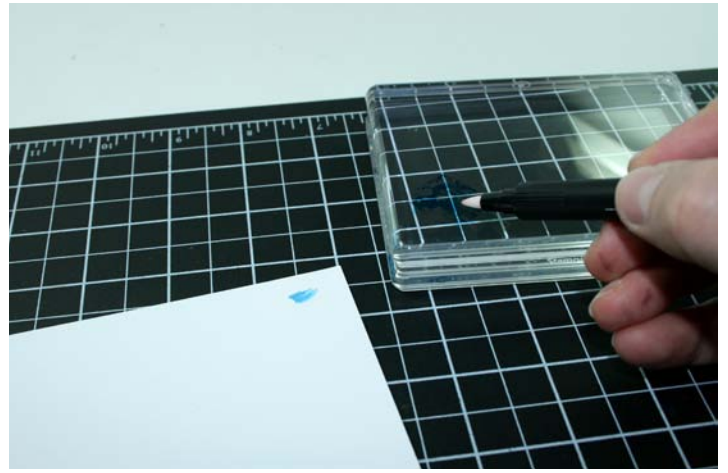
Step Two:

Clean stamp and remove from acrylic block.



Step Three:

Use acrylic block as palette for Stampin' Write ink. Color directly to acrylic block with brush end of marker.



Step Four:

Using blender pen, pick color up from acrylic block. Begin coloring image.



Step Four Continued



Step Five:

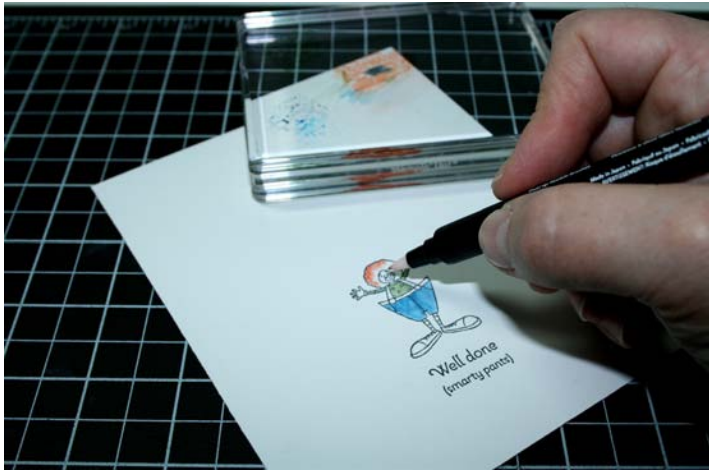
Layer colors to create highlights and shading.



Step Six:

Between colors, scribble blender pen on scrap paper until it wipes clean. Continue adding color.





Step Seven:

Repeat with a variety of colors until image is complete. Use as desired.
